As part of this holistic assessment, the committee does carefully consider all scores, and particularly the verbal and writing sections of those tests, as strong scores in those areas have been indicative of success in the program. However, we also place considerable weight on the personal statement, recommendation letters, and the student's background and resume in coming to a final decision.
